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Class Goals:

This is a college level course and is not required. This course is intended for students who are interested in a math or science based major in college. It will prepare you for those college entrance exams.

This class will require you to work hard, follow directions, pay attention, participate, and communicate. If you hold up your end you will be amazed at the results!

Content:

During the first semester we will cover chapters 6 through 9. Those topics include chapter 6, Trigonometric Functions, chapter 7, Analytic Trigonometry, chapter 8, Applications of Trigonometric Functions, and chapter 9, Polar Coordinates. You will take a semester exam and it will count for 20% of your semester grade.

During the second semester we will cover chapters 10 through 13, 5 and 4. Those topics include chapter 10, Analytic Geometry, chapter 11, Systems of Equations and Inequalities, chapter 12, Sequences; Inductions; the Binomial Theorem, chapter 13, Counting and Probability, chapter 5, Exponential and Logarithmic Functions, and chapter 4, Polynomial and Rational Functions. You will take a semester exam and it will count for 20% of your semester grade.

Grading:

20% Homework

- Homework will be based on correctness.
- You must show all your work on your homework. You will not receive credit for an assignment without work.
- You must use a pencil on your homework.
- Your name, the lesson, and the assignment will be written at the top of your paper. Papers without this information will be put on the board. You have until the end of the chapter to claim them for full credit. It is your responsibility to get the missing information on your paper. At the end of the chapter all unclaimed papers will be thrown away and zeros will be given.

40% Quizzes

- All quizzes must be finished by the end of the day if you started it in class. If you are absent you will have two days to take the quiz but you must finish it the same day you start. After the deadline it will be graded as is.
- You must show all your work on quizzes. You will not receive full credit on a problem without work.
- You must use a pencil on quizzes.

40% Tests

- All tests must be finished by the end of the day if you started it in class. If you are absent you will have two days to take the test but you must finish it the same day you start. After the deadline it will be graded as is.
- You must show all your work on tests. You will not receive full credit on a problem without work.
- You must use a pencil on tests.
